This matter having come before the Court on the application of Christopher J. Christie, United States Attorney for the District of New Jersey (by Erez Liebermann, Assistant U.S. Attorney), and defendant ROBERT MOORE (by his attorney K. Anthony Thomas, Esq.), for an Order granting a continuance of the proceedings in the above-captioned matter for a period of 90 days to allow the defendant and the Office of the United States Attorney for the District of New Jersey to conduct plea negotiations, and the defendant being aware that he has the right to have the matter submitted to a grand jury within thirty days of the date of his initial appearance pursuant to Title 18 of the United States Code, Section 3161(b), and the defendant having waived that right and consented to the continuance in the above-captioned matter, and for good cause shown,

IT IS THE FINDING OF THIS COURT that this action should be continued for the following reasons:

- (1) Plea negotiations are currently in progress, and both the United States and the defendant desire additional time to complete their discussions. A plea in this

matter would render grand jury proceedings and any subsequent trial of this matter unnecessary; and

- (2) Pursuant to Title 18 of the United States Code, Section 3161(h)(8), the ends of justice served by granting the continuance outweigh the best interest of the public and the defendant in a speedy trial.

WHEREFORE, IT IS on this 15 day of June 2006,


ORDERED that this matter be, and it hereby is, continued for a period of 90 days from June 14, 2006 through September 12, 2006;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the period from June 14, 2006 through September 12, 2006 shall be excludable in computing time under the Speedy Trial Act of 1974.
